

Pupil Premium

What is the pupil premium?

The Pupil Premium provides additional funding on top of the main funding a school receives. It is targeted at students from disadvantaged backgrounds to ensure they benefit from the same opportunities as students from less deprived families and to close attainment gaps.

From September 2015, the premium will be worth £1320 per pupil. This amount will be allocated to students who at any point in the past 6 years have been in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM).

An amount of £1,900 will be allocated to any student who has been continuously looked after for the past six months or who has been adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 or who has left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order.

Why is there a pupil premium?

Students who have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in their school career have consistently lower educational attainment than those who have never been eligible.

How many pupils at Fringford are eligible for the Pupil Premium?

From September 2015, 8 pupils at Fringford are eligible for the Pupil Premium

Who is eligible for free school meals (FSM)?

Free school meals are offered to children whose parents receive:

- Income Support
- Income based Employment & Support Allowance
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit provided your annual income as assessed by the Inland Revenue does not exceed £16,190 and provided that Working Tax Credit is not included.

How will the impact of the spending of the Pupil Premium be measured?

At Fringford, progress of all pupils is carefully monitored throughout the year through formative and summative assessment. Specific interventions that are utilized for pupils awarded Pupil Premium will be monitored before and after intervention has taken place in order to assess cost effectiveness. Our aim is to raise attainment and close gaps.
