

Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium

From September 2013 all primary schools across England have received a share of the Government £150m pa [Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium](#). The funding is ring-fenced and must be spent on improving the provision and quality of PE and sport in primary schools so that pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

Fringford Primary has received £8410 for the academic year 2015-16.

90% of this funding has been spent on our annual **affiliation to [North Oxfordshire School Sport Partnership \(NOSSP\)](#)**. This [affiliation](#) gives Fringford C of E Primary School access to regular expert advice from [secondary PE specialists](#), weekly in-school support for teachers from specialist [PE mentors](#), quality assured [professional development training](#) for teachers and teaching assistants, occasional input and support from qualified [sports coaches](#), access to regular [sports competitions and festivals](#) including national [School Games](#) competitions, support with the development and delivery of primary [Change4Life sports clubs](#) and evaluation tools to help measure and monitor progress and impact.

NOSSP affiliation also provides automatic full primary [membership to Youth Sport Trust](#) and a range of additional benefits and support including the [Youth Sport Trust Quality Mark](#).

The remaining 10% PE and Sport Premium has been spent:

- providing transport to and from sporting activities;
- organising a visit from a national badminton player (Sports for Schools);
- facilitating additional sports clubs both during and before school.

Impact

The partnership with NOSSP has had a significant impact on physical education and sport participation within Fringford Primary School. This includes, improved pupil attitudes to PE through a more inclusive curriculum that inspires and engages all pupils. The staff feel more confident and competent at providing quality teaching and learning. Fringford has also participated in many competitive activities within the partnership, with the year 3/4 football A team, Quad Kids A team and year 5/6 boys cricket team reaching county final competitions (stage 3).

Attainment has also been positively impacted by the partnership. The children have an increasing awareness of the benefits of sport to health and wellbeing. Positive behaviour is encouraged through the core values and the children have a good sense of 'fair play' and exhibit positive behaviour throughout the school. Through the young leaders training in years 5 and 6, the children are able to increase their own self-esteem and ownership of their growth in PE.

Fringford C of E Primary School has achieved Silver Youth Sport Trust Quality Mark 2015-16 for our current PE provision and outcomes, and Gold School Games Kitemark 2015-16 for our commitment to

the development of competition, school sport and physical education across our school and the local community.

Fringford Primary will receive £8410 for the academic year 2016-17.

The monies received in this academic year will be distributed in the same manner as to last year (90% to NOSSP and 10% within school – see above for a more detailed breakdown). We aim to increase the number of sports clubs available to the children and attend more events held both within and outside of the Sports Partnership. This has already started with 13 children attending a cross-country event that the school has not previously been part of and a break time skipping club has started once a week.

The impact of the allocation of the sports premium will be further measured with a survey of the children and parents within the school; future planning will be based around these findings.
