Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium

From September 2013 all primary schools across England have received a share of the Government £150m pa Primary Physical Education and Sport Premium. The funding is ring-fenced and must be spent on improving the provision and quality of PE and sport in primary schools so that pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

Fringford C of E Primary School have received £8,420 for the current academic year.

90% of this funding has been spent on our annual **affiliation to North Oxfordshire School Sport Partnership (NOSSP).** This **affiliation** gives **Fringford School** access to regular expert advice from a **secondary PE specialist**, weekly in-school support for teachers from specialist **PE mentors** [90% schools only], quality assured professional development training for teachers and teaching assistants, occasional input and support from qualified **sports coaches**, access to regular **sports competitions and festivals** including national **School Games** competitions, support with the development and delivery of primary **Change4Life sports clubs** and evaluation tools to help measure and monitor progress and impact.

NOSSP affiliation also provides automatic full primary <u>membership to Youth Sport Trust</u> and a range of additional benefits and support including the Youth Sport Trust Quality Mark.

The remaining 10% PE and Sport Premium has been spent on new equipment and coach funding.
